**THE BRINTON MUSEUM** (Big Horn, WY) presents *The Geography of a Life: Dan Powell's Photographs in the American West*, curated by **Keith F. Davis**, opening in the S. K. Johnston, Jr. Family Gallery on April 29.

Internationally known, award-winning American photographer Dan Powell taught at the University of Oregon from 1988 until his retirement in 2015. He has had prestigious solo and group shows around the world and his work is found in numerous museums and private collections. In 2021, Mr. Powell generously gave a group of 84 landscape photographs to The Brinton Museum, made primarily between 1983 and 1991. The Brinton Museum's exhibition includes selections from this donation which represent the nature of his talent and his superb artistic vision.

Powell grew up in the Yakima Valley of south-central Washington State. In 1991, he made three extended photographic trips to the states of Washington and Idaho, another to eastern Oregon and Idaho and a final one through California, Arizona and Utah. The body of work produced during this time reflects a subjective sense of poetry and emotion which are central to his vision. *The Geography of a Life* invites the viewer to step into Powell's artistic sensibilities and experience the landscape of the American West through the photographer's eye.
